

LETTER FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER



The creation of Altura's Strategic Business Plan for 2023 began with our Statement of Purpose, which underscored our permanent commitment to improving the financial lives of our Members and being a partner to help them achieve their dreams. As a credit union committed to quality and process improvement, we are committed to measuring our performance, and based on the myriad of metrics, Altura has a strong, future-focused plan that ended in a banner year.

Our Net Promoter Score was an enviable 74.2%, well above the industry average. It's a measurement of loyalty and whether a Member is likely to refer us. That number has been increasing steadily for the past four years, a good indication we're on the right track. In a year when other financial institutions floundered, our Membership Growth was up by 8.2%. Solid increases in assets and revenue reflect a robust and reliable institution. Our rates for both borrowing and saving are among the most competitive in the region.

In 2023, we added multiple supporting features to our digital banking. We made it easier to make branch appointments online, with brand new software. Enhanced underwriting was implemented so we now look at 125 additional criteria, aside from FICO scores, to say, "Yes," to loans. I'm particularly proud of our Credit Builder Loan which allows Members to rebuild their credit as well increase their credit score. The loan then transforms into a savings certificate, making it a dual-purpose product that can make a tangible difference in someone's life.

We were a driving force in communities across Riverside County, the fastest growing county in our state, and in 2023 we renewed our commitment to help provide the financial services and products to help meet the needs of that growth. We have taken it upon ourselves to address the issue of banking deserts, underserved areas typically remote and often deemed by the industry as unprofitable. Altura believes in the possibilities in all our communities, and we are committed to bring opportunities to places too often ignored.

We continue to champion our local iconic and cultural landmark, The Cheech. In 2023, we were the main sponsor of the Chicano Art and Cultural Center's annual celebration. Altura was also instrumental in the commissioning of two murals, one in the Casa Blanca neighborhood of Riverside and one in Moreno Valley. Both honor the region's Hispanic heritage, and both celebrate exceptionally gifted local artists.

Meeting the financial needs of our Membership while making a difference in the communities where we live and work, are the main ingredients of our success as an institution. We believe that you can't go wrong by doing what's right.

Speaking of doing what's right, we have the best employees in the industry. Our performance and progress depend on them. Over the past three years we've invested heavily in their training as well as their personal development. We've provided encouragement and affordable access to formal education, expanding tuition reimbursement, as well as student loan repayment programs.

Altura Credit Union finds its way onto most local and regional Best Employer lists. Great employees are difficult to find, and I am a firm believer in treating them the way I want them to treat our Members.

It is my privilege to report, at the close of 2023, Altura Credit Union remains a very strong, stable, and secure financial institution, ready to meet any of the challenges the future may have in store. We provide financial tools and bring opportunities to the table; we're here to help Riverside County families discover the possibilities and fulfill their promise.

Following a year filled with triumphs, we were shocked in early January of 2024, when the Altura family suffered a profoundly sad and difficult loss. Ofelia Valdez-Yeager, known affectionately as "Ofie", a former esteemed member of our Board of Directors and a dear friend to many of us, had passed away. Ofie played a critical role in making The Cheech a beacon of hope and opportunity in Riverside County. Her foresight and dedication ensured Altura Credit Union became an integral part of this vital community center, empowering families to learn, grow, and thrive.

Ofelia served on Altura's Board of Directors from 1994 to 2020 and left an enduring legacy. She was the first female Chairperson, and served in that capacity when I was named CEO. Her wisdom and guidance impacted me professionally and personally in so many meaningful ways. Her passion for our community and her generosity touched everyone she met, and she left an indelible mark within each of our hearts, at Altura, and in our communities.

She was the first female Chair to lead Altura's Board of Directors and she was a driving force behind fund-raising efforts to establish and sustain The Cheech. Ofelia was a teacher, an administrator, a trailblazer, a patron of the arts and a connoisseur of culture. She was intelligent, optimistic, warm and had a wonderful, contagious smile.

And she was my friend.





So, the next time you see a veteran walking with a service dog, remember, there might just be a big heart from the Altura Foundation beating alongside them.




